# **Remembering Erica Ponting**

About 30 Bunyip residents joined together for the inaugural *Erica's Walk* on Wednesday 2nd May in honour of a much loved and respected community citizen, Mrs Erica Joy Ponting, who at aged 68 sadly lost her short battle with cancer on 20th February 2018. The walk was organised by Bunyip & District Community House and family, and participants walked along the streets of Bunyip and were led by her husband Dennis Ponting.

Erica's passion in retirement was keeping fit as well as assisting others, especially the elderly in the community, to exercise for their health. She was involved in the Heart Foundation's weekly walks which involved about half a dozen dedicated walkers meeting each Monday and walking to keep fit. This official activity was documented and figures sent to the Heart Foundation for statistical purposes.

Close friend Maree McRae said, "Erica was a valuable member of the Bunyip Slimmers Club for many years. She held various positions in the club, including the Treasurer and President." "She was greatly admired and highly respected by everyone. She was a great organiser and ran the club in a friendly and relaxed manner. Erica was an amazing lady, who was the heart and soul of our club."

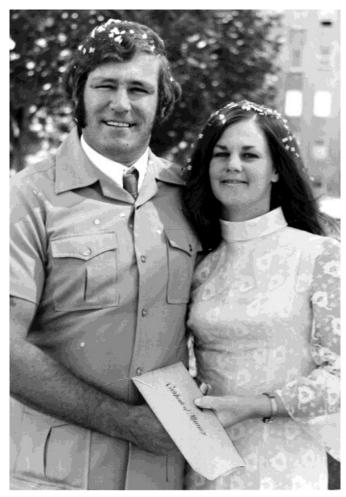


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## Remembering Erica Ponting (cont'd)

Erica also ran the 'Hillview Gems' (now known as 'Erica's Gems') every Friday morning at Hillview Bunyip Aged Care. It was an exercise group Erica formed for people living in the Independent Living Units as well as for the elderly in the community. She researched various forms of exercises and would often make suggestions on how to improve the exercises sessions for the Hillview residents.

Erica also organised Blumes Fashion shows at Hillview Bunyip Aged Care for the residents who were unable to get to the shops. Blumes Fashion is a company which features fashions for the elderly, and Erica would organise a show twice or more a year. The community was also invited to the shows at a small admission charge which was donated back to Hillview.

Erica's desire to help others extended to her being a Board Member of the Bunyip Community Medical Centre, where she was involved in the sale of the centre to Dr Georgy which benefited the community.

Erica was also a valued Board Member of Hillview Bunyip Aged Care, and this led to her volunteering her clerical and administration skills once a week to assist the administration staff at Hillview. She continued doing this until her health prevented her from continuing to do so.

Hillview Board Member and former employer, Gerard Collins from Gerard Collins Real Estate said, "Erica was a valued and much loved employee. All the staff held her in high esteem, sought out for her wisdom and business skills. Erica had a calming effect and carried out her role in business, as a very skilled and professional sales woman. Clients warmed to her openness, honesty, and trusted advice. She assisted me personally in the marketing of the Hillview Independent Living Units."

Erica was married to Dennis for over 52 years. She and Dennis settled in Bunyip in 1987. The couple had five children. Tragically two of her sons were killed in road accidents 12 months apart.

Erica was enthusiastic in all she did and put in a great effort for the benefit of others, and will be greatly missed by our community. She will be remembered for her bright bubbly personality, her sense of humour, her attention to detail and her desire to help others.

Erica's funeral was held in Pakenham on Friday 27th February, attended by family and friends.

# Join the movement and stop Hanson's mega quarry

The Mt. Cannibal & District Preservation Group will be holding a Community Information Meeting on Sunday **27th May 2018 from 12 noon to 2pm** at the Tonimbuk Hall, Gembrook-Tonimbuk Road. There will be a free sausage sizzle with tea and coffee provided.

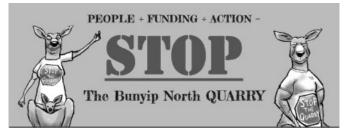
There are some misconceptions about the effects that the proposed Hanson mega quarry will have on our community. Firstly, it's not just the effects it will have on the immediate environment. We are all aware of the impact the quarry will have on the unique flora and fauna in the area as well as on Mt Cannibal; but there is a very real potential of pollution to our air quality and waterways. Just because the quarry site is over the highway in the North, doesn't mean the silica dust and noise won't head downhill to Bunyip and Garfield. The estimated impact area is 7km and there is real potential for shock waves within that radius. And as you can see from the impact map on page 6, Bunyip Town Centre is only 5km away from the quarry and Garfield Town Centre is 4.5km.

A lot of people assume that Hanson will ensure these issues won't happen, and they'll put in contingency plans for any disaster, after all isn't that why they're having the Environment Effects Statement (EES). But why should we trust Hanson when they haven't done it with other quarries they own. For example in 2016 EPA fined Hanson for non-compliance at their Sancrox Quarry as they failed to monitor the environmental impact of its activities. Hanson also originally acquired the land for the quarry in North Bunyip under the guise of pastoral use, not the extraction of granite.

Secondly that our roads will handle the increase in traffic from the quarry, around 550 truck movements daily. Due to the constant flow of large double carriage quarry trucks from the proposed quarry, there will be increased pressure on the Hope Street / Princes Highway intersection, seeing locals struggling to combat the already inadequate highway exit / entry intersection.

After speaking to VicRoads at Hanson's Information Session, they confirmed they would not be updating this intersection, like the recent Longwarry overpass upgrade, and would see no need to do so unless there were enough incidents to warrant an upgrade.

Not only will the excess traffic from the quarry cause additional damage and potholes on our roads, particularly since they weren't laid with heavy utility trucks in mind, locals will also be forced to take deters to avoid the extra traffic, which will put more pressure



on surrounding roads and on the A'Beckett Road / Princes Highway intersection. There will also be more people using Longwarry-Nar Nar Goon Road to head through Garfield and Tynong to get on to the highway via Nar Nar Goon.

Thirdly, there is a view that this proposed quarry will only effect surrounding properties. It won't just be the parts of our community that surround the mega quarry that'll be effected. It'll effect our towns.

Our population is increasing at a rapid rate. This quarry will be built too close to growing communities and way too close to existing houses. Close enough that we will be effected by the dust, noise and tremors. This quarry may have been in a location that was suitable 15 years ago, but as you will see from the below table, there is a staggering predication for population increase for our communities, and increase population, big trucks and town roads don't mix.

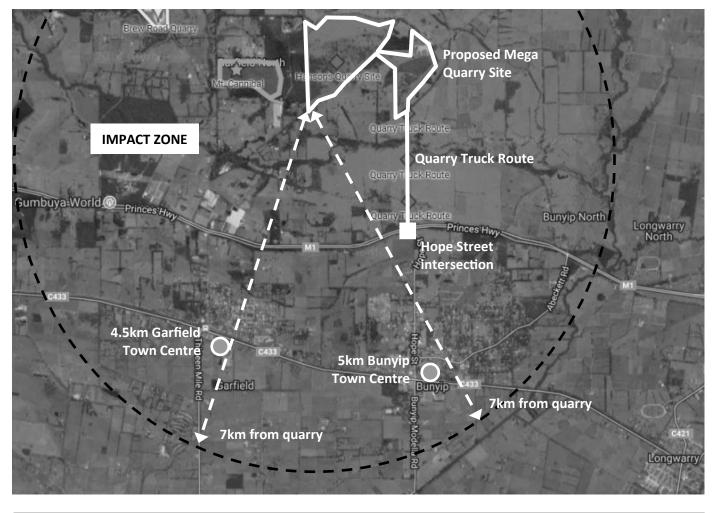

Lastly, we need the granite for construction and it'll only be for 12 years or so. It'll be 100 years, and yes the State government needs granite for infrastructure projects, but it's in the wrong location. When Hanson's first surveyed the area 12 years ago, it was a lot less populated and no one really knew the environmental significance of the area. The granite ridge is a long one, so as convenient as the location is for transporting, it's no longer the right area for this proposed mega quarry.

A cheeky new online video from Environment Protection Authority Victoria (EPA) is helping Victorians to fight widespread illegal dumping of skip bin waste.

The animated video gives a simple tip to make sure your skip bin waste goes to the right place - ask the right questions before you hand over the money.

EPA wants you to ask the skip bin company if they can provide documents that show your household garbage or renovation waste went to the right place; a licensed landfill or recycling facility will give them paperwork whenever they drop off a load.

By seeing receipts, you can make sure your waste is not dumped in the bush, local parks or creeks, on farmland, at a former industrial site or in a rented warehouse.

Illegal dumping costs the State Government and local Councils more than \$100 million a year.

# Have you had your flu vaccination?

St John Ambulance (Victoria) is urging all Victorians to get their flu vaccination off the back off new research released by the not-for-profit.

Following a particularly severe 2017 flu season, which saw 2.5 times more reported cases of the flu in Australia from the year prior, and 200 reported deaths in Victoria attributed to complications from the flu; the research has found that Victorians are still taking a relaxed attitude towards vaccination. In particular the following.

- 40 per cent of Victorians do not believe that the flu vaccination is necessary.
- Only 38 per cent of Victorians have been vaccinated against the flu in the last 12 months.

The research also uncovered the extensive impact that cold and flu symptoms are having on Victorians, their families and their employers. In particular the following.

- 85 per cent of all Victorians have experienced some type of symptoms in the past 12 months.
- Nearly a third of Victorians (29 per cent) have taken two or more days off work due to cold and flu symptoms in the past 12 months.
- Victorians miss out on an average of 1.8 days socialising and/or engaging in family activities due to cold or flu symptoms.



St John Ambulance Victoria CEO Gordon Botwright said that the importance of flu vaccinations cannot be overlooked.

"We saw the impacts of the flu hit a wide range of the community last year, so the time to get vaccinated is now to ensure that the impact is lessened in 2018."

"Flu vaccinations are designed to protect Victorians, so we want to encourage everyone to get one before flu season comes into full swing", he said.

So don't wait to get sick, get your vaccination to prevent you getting the flu this season.

# **The Federal Budget**

## How will it affect you?

This year's Federal Budget is likely to be the last before the next Federal Election, and not surprisingly, containing tax cuts and a confirmation of the Government's commitment to lower corporate taxes.

Some of the key points are summarised below.

- A one year exemption from the 'work test' will apply to recent retirees who have less than \$300,000 in total super savings. Currently, people aged 65 to 74 must work a minimum of 40 hours in any consecutive 30-day period in the financial year in order to contribute to super.
- From 1st July 2019, fees when exiting a super fund will be banned. Also the administration / investment fees charged on super funds will be capped at 3% p.a. on accounts with balances of less than \$6,000.
- A new tax offset for low and middle income earners, of up to \$530 per year, is proposed. This is in addition to the existing 'Low Income Tax Offset'.
- The Government is increasing the Pension Work Bonus to allow aged pensioners to earn an extra \$50 per fortnight (up to \$300 per fortnight) without reducing their pension.
- More aged care places to assist older Australians. The Government will create 14,000 additional highlevel home care packages over the next four years, in order to support those individuals who choose to access aged care services from their home. It will also release 13,500 additional residential aged care places.

- Life insurance will only be able to be offered in
- superannuation accounts on an 'opt-in basis' to new members under 25 years of age, members with 'inactive' accounts, or an account balance under \$6,000. This is designed to ensure that young people, or those with low account balances, do not have their retirement savings eroded by premiums on insurance policies that they do not require or are not aware of.
- One initiative which did not proceed was the proposal made in the 2017 Budget to increase the Medicare Levy by 0.5%. This change will not go ahead and it will remain at 2%.

It's important to remember that these are still only proposals and the final format and dates they come into play are all subject to the passing of legislation.

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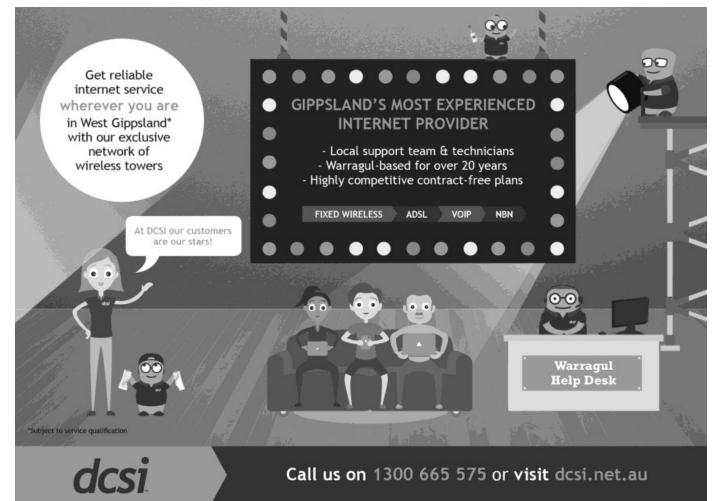

# **Bunyip Fire Brigade – ready to serve**

## FIRE RESTRICTIONS HAVE BEEN LIFTED

However, you still have to abide by local laws as stated in the Cardinia Shire Open Air Burning Policy. You can find the policy on the shire's website www.cardinia.vic.gov.au under 'Fire, flood and emergencies' > 'Open Air Burning Policy - Cardinia Shire Council'.

If according to shire by-laws you are able to burn-off, we ask that before you do, you consider the following.

- Ring the Burn Off Registration phone number on 1800 668 511 or you can also visit CFA website at www.cfa.vic.gov.au/contact/register-your-burn-off to complete the Burn Off Notification Form. Unregistered burn-offs can cause us to be called out unnecessarily and you won't be embarrassed when three fire trucks arrive on your doorstep.
- 2. Check the weather forecast to ensure it's not windy.
- 3. Do you have an adequate water supply close by?

- 4. Is the area around the burn site cleared of other vegetation?
- CFA
- 5. Have you notified your neighbours?
- 6. Ensure that the fire is 100% extinguished before you leave the burn site.

The brigade has been extremely busy over the past few weeks with the brigade being called out almost 70 times so far this year. Despite the recent changes in weather, the soil and vegetation are still very dry. So please take care and ensure you never leave a fire unattended.

Also... no doubt you have already lit you wood heater, but did you check the flue before you struck that match? I am sure that over the course of winter, the brigade will respond to at least one chimney fire caused by a dirty or blocked flue. Will it be your place?

# Monthly local police update (17th April to 10th May, 2018)

Well done to the local RSL Branches, community groups and people who organised and made ANZAC day what it was. It's an honour to be able to assist. We estimated the crowd numbers to be just over one thousand in total between Nar Nar Goon (c.250), Tynong (c.180), Garfield (c.100) and Bunyip (c.500). We're proud to be local.

We have had an unfortunate seasonal increase in dangerous and very illegal firearms behaviour occurring north of the highway over the past few months, which would have to upset most legitimate shooters and hunters that I know particularly due to the manner in which it is occurring and the wrong attention it attracts. There have been some pretty ugly examples left behind in populated areas which would indicate that these people clearly do not know what they are doing or don't care.

Our advice would be for all licensed firearms holders to ensure you comply and have checked what you are doing before you do it. It may be attractive to see something moving – but it's not the right thing to do just because it moves. I have met people who don't think it's very funny at all to be on the outgoing end of the barrel. Doesn't sound very respectful when it's put like that.

Since our last report we have the following incidents.

- Field contacted twelve people for suspicious behaviour with four each in Bunyip and Garfield; and two each in Tynong North and Pakenham.
- Issued twenty Infringement Notices (on the spot fines) for traffic offences.
- Referred seven people to other agencies for assistance.
- Attended six Family Incidents with one each in Cardinia, Bunyip and Garfield North; and three in Pakenham.
- Issued and served four Family Violence Intervention orders.
- Interviewed and charged eight people who will be going to court for criminal or traffic matters.
- Attended a single vehicle collision in Cora Lynn where a car ran off the road and the driver went to hospital.
- Two burglaries in Bunyip with one involving the theft of very sentimental jewellery; and one involving theft of a four wheel motor bike.
- Theft of two cars from rural locations with one in Garfield North and one in Iona.





VICTORIA POLICE

- Theft of farm piping in Vervale and an attempted theft of a pressure tank at another property in Vervale where the thieves were confronted by the owner and fled; theft of building material in Bunyip; theft of building tools from a building site in Garfield.
- Criminal damage to a sign in Garfield North.
- A house fire in Bayles where the owner has been interviewed.
- A Yarragon man being identified, interviewed and charged for a taxi fare evasion in Garfield.
- Four reports of people shooting illegally on private property without permission or permits.
- A false report to emergency services regarding a possible drowning.
- A driver wanted for evading police in Iona.
- Search for a lost mobile phone in Longwarry.
- Locating a missing person in Bunyip.

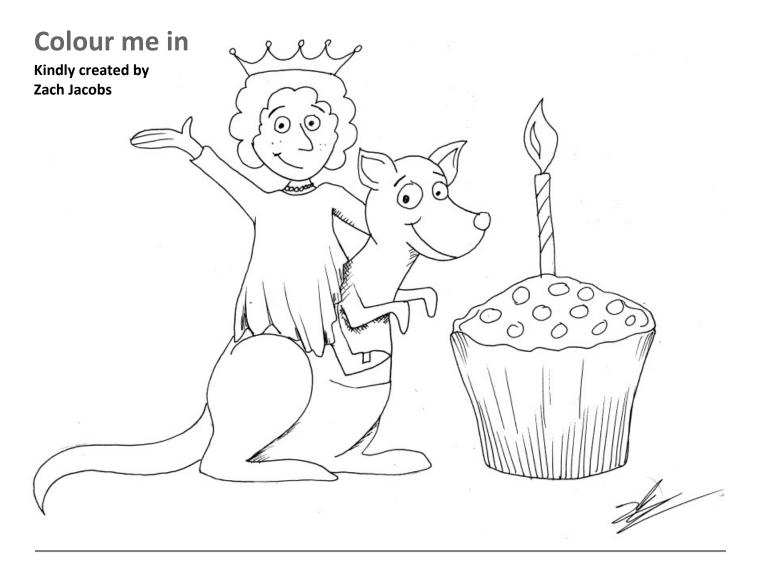
I keep reiterating to **please call 000 for all emergencies** – Police, Fire Brigade and Ambulance attendance. I say this because we hear from people that they get confused by some TV ads. Our advice is that the 000 call takers, radio operators and agencies are always there to answer if you think our attendance is required. They can assess all calls and determine appropriate action based on knowledge and professional experience.

We sometimes go to jobs where great people have driven amazing distances to help out friends that are in need – but unfortunately sometimes things are bit more urgent and a safe timely 000 phone call can get immediate help where you need it a bit quicker than you can drive. We call that a 'welfare check'.

Another example supporting this is that you may not see us at the station as often as you like – but since the last monthly report Bunyip Police have done twenty seven 'on road' patrol shifts. That means we have been out and about on the road doing a wide variety of police type things for the majority of our shifts. We call that thinly spread.

Funnily enough some people would prefer to know we are at the station most of the time because that means we're not somewhere else...

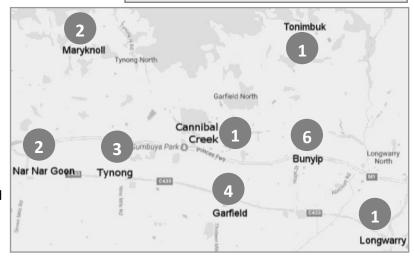
